REMINDERS

- Please do not use the river to dispose of leaves, pine needles and other debris. Though the river will
 take it downstream, much of it ends up on someone else's waterfront requiring them to clean it up!
 Not to mention the fact that DEC has told us that doing so can carry a fine! The transfer station is
 open every Saturday and Wednesday and will gladly take this material.
- Rules on the Water, know your law NYS General Boating Regulations state that vessel speed is limited to <u>5 mph when within 100 feet of the shore, a dock, pier, raft, float or anchored boat</u> and local ordinances may enforce additional restrictions. Though we have no posted speed limit signs on Higley, the law remains in effect—please observe the 5 mph speed limit where appropriate and boat safely! Powerboat Operation - **BRIANNA'S LAW** (Signed August 2019)

Those born on or after Jan. 1, 1993 will need a boating safety certificate beginning in 2020. Those born on or after Jan. 1, 1988 will need a boating safety certificate beginning in 2022. Those born on or after Jan. 1, 1983 will need a boating safety certificate beginning in 2023. Those born on or after Jan. 1, 1978 will need a boating safety certificate beginning in 2024. ALL MOTOR BOAT OPERATORS REGARDLESS OF AGE WILL NEED A BOATING SAFETY CERTIFICATE BEGINNING IN 2025.

DON'T FORGET LAST YEAR'S NEW EVENT—JULY 4TH BOAT PARADE - We are complementing the Kids' Parade with a parade of antique through late classic boats (antique 1919-1942; classic 1943-1975;
